Investment Objective Achieving long term capital growth in real terms and steadily increasing income. Our aim is to achieve a higher rate of total return than the FTSE Actuaries All-Share Index Total Return through investing in a diversified portfolio of stocks.

Fund Managers' Comments

In October, the net asset value (on a cum income basis with debt at fair value) fell 4.8%, underperforming the FTSE All-Share benchmark which fell 4.1%.

UK equity markets saw a 'flight to safety' in October as a result of heightened geopolitical and economic uncertainty. This caused defensive sectors such as utilities and consumer staples to outperform, and (for related reasons) larger companies within the FTSE 100 materially outperformed small and medium sized companies. For this portfolio this detracted from relative returns, as the portfolio holds an overweight position in small/medium sized UK companies relative to the FTSE All-Share benchmark, as well as an overweight position in some cyclical sectors such as financials and industrials. In the Fund Manager's view, the best valuation opportunity currently lies in small and medium sized, often domestic businesses. This is where sentiment is currently very poor and valuations are often at steep discounts to their long-run average.

The transactions during the month reflected the Fund Manager's views that the UK currently presents the best value opportunity. The largest sales included (US listed) semiconductor equipment manufacturer Applied Materials and heavy equipment manufacturer Caterpillar. These sales funded additions to UK holdings such as building materials company Sigmaroc, brick manufacturer Ibstock and cardboard packaging producer DS Smith.


